Worldwide interest in classic Bundesliga pairing of Borussia Dortmund and FC Bayern München bigger than ever before

- Match to be broadcast live in more than 200 countries

When Borussia Dortmund and FC Bayern München take to the field in Dortmund on Saturday, November 4, the latest encounter between these teams will be watched not only by millions of soccer fans in Germany. International interest in this showdown of the giants is set to be huge as well: more international media outlets than ever before will be sending their own teams of reporters to cover this classic Bundesliga pairing from the sidelines.

The game will be broadcast live in over 200 countries across the globe. The Bundesliga's international media partners will be able to access live footage from more than 20 cameras around the stadium.
